The Community Service Tax Credit Program (CSP) provides an opportunity for private, non-profit organizations and public health care entities to improve their ability to undertake major capital campaigns.

A RETURN ON YOUR DONATION

Businesses and individuals subject to Kansas income tax are eligible to receive a 50% tax credit through this program. Donations must be \$250 or greater and the payment should come directly from the business or the individual.

State tax credits reduce the total amount of taxes owed to the state. They are a way for a taxpayer to substantially reduce the cost of making a contribution to a charitable organization.

These credits are transferable AND refundable.

HOW TO CLAIM THE CREDIT

To claim the credit, a donor must complete Schedule K-60, which is filed with their income tax return.

HOW DO TAX CREDITS WORK?

Through CSP, the state authorizes selected non-profit organizations to offer tax credits to donors for the benefit of approved projects. Projects should be new or one-time in nature and create lasting value for the non-profit organization.

Donations to these organizations support projects making an impact in communities across the state in areas like childcare, crime prevention, youth technical training, healthcare, and more.
